



## Holy Eucharist

### GATHERING

**Priest** Grace, mercy and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ be with you.  
**All** **And also with you.**

*Everyone is made welcome; the Presiding Priest may use the following or alternative words:*

Since early days Christians have observed with great devotion the time of our Lord's passion and resurrection and prepared for this by a season of penitence and fasting.

Ash Wednesday has been in the Christian calendar since the 8th century. I invite you to the observance of a holy Lent, by self-examination and repentance, by prayer, fasting, and self-denial; and by reading and meditating on God's holy word.

### Collect for the Day

**Priest** Almighty and everlasting God, you despise nothing you have made and forgive the sins of all who are penitent. Create and make in us new and contrite hearts, that we, worthily lamenting our sins and acknowledging our brokenness, may obtain of you, the God of all mercy, perfect remission and forgiveness; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever.

**All** **Amen.**

### LITURGY OF THE WORD

*The appointed readings for day from the Revised Common Lectionary are shared.*



### First Reading

*The reading is announced, "A reading from the book of....."*

*At the end of the reading, the reader says,*

**Reader** The word of the Lord

**All** **Thanks be to God**

### Psalm

*The Psalm set for the day is then shared, either with a refrain, or responsively by half or whole verse.*

### Second Reading

*The reading is announced, "A reading from....."*

*At the end of the reading, the reader says,*

**Reader** The word of the Lord

**All** **Thanks be to God**

### Gospel Reading

*The Gospel reading is usually read by the deacon where one is present, or by the Presiding Priest or assisting minister.*

Praise to you, O Christ, King of eternal glory.  
The Lord is a great God,  
O that today you would listen to his voice.  
Harden not your hearts. *cf Psalm 95: 3, 8*

**A SERMON is preached**

**Priest** Every year at the time of the Christian Passover we celebrate our redemption through the death a resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Lent is a time to prepare for this celebration and to renew our life in the paschal mystery. We begin this holy season by remembering our need for repentance, and for the mercy and forgiveness proclaimed in the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

### Penitential Rite and Ashing

We begin our journey to Easter with the sign of ashes, an ancient sign, speaking of the frailty and uncertainty of human life, and marking the penitence of the community as a whole.

Let us kneel before our Creator and Redeemer.

*Silence is then kept for reflection.*

### Psalm 51. 1-18

**Refrain (R) Create in me a clean heart, O God.**

Have mercy on me, O God, according to your loving kindness; in your great compassion blot out my offences.

Wash me through and through from my wickedness and cleanse me from my sin. **(R)**

For I know my transgressions, and my sin is ever before me. Against you only have I sinned and done what is evil in your sight.

And so you are justified when you speak and upright in your judgement.

Indeed, I have been wicked from my birth, a sinner from my mother's womb. **(R)**

For behold, you look for truth deep within me, and will make me understand wisdom secretly.

Purge me from my sin, and I shall be pure; wash me, and I shall be clean indeed.

Make me hear of joy and gladness, that the body you have broken may rejoice. **(R)**

Hide your face from my sins and blot out all my iniquities.

Create in me a clean heart, O God, and renew a right spirit within me.

Cast me not away from your presence and take not your Holy Spirit from me. **(R)**

Give me the joy of your saving help again and sustain me with your bountiful Spirit.

I shall teach your ways to the wicked, and sinners shall return to you.

Deliver me from death, O God, and my tongue shall sing of your righteousness, O God of my salvation. **(R)**

Open my lips, O Lord, and my mouth shall proclaim your praise.

Had you desired it, I would have offered sacrifice, but you take no delight in burnt-offerings.

The sacrifice of God is a troubled spirit; a broken and contrite heart, O God, you will not despise. **(R)**

Priest Praying together:  
 All **Most holy and merciful Father, we confess to You, to one another, and to the whole communion of saints in heaven and on earth, that we have sinned by our own fault in thought, word, and deed; by what we have done, and by what we have left undone.**

Priest We have not loved You with our whole heart, and mind, and strength.  
 We have not loved our neighbours as ourselves.  
 We have not forgiven others as we have been forgiven.  
 All **Have mercy on us, Lord.**

We have been deaf to Your call to serve as Christ served us.  
 We have not been true to the mind of Christ.  
 We have grieved your Holy Spirit.  
 All **Have mercy on us, Lord.**

We confess to You, Lord, all our past unfaithfulness: the pride, hypocrisy, and impatience of our lives  
 All **We confess to you, Lord.**

Our self-indulgent appetites and ways, and our exploitation of other people,  
 All **We confess to you, Lord.**

Our anger at our own frustration, and our envy of those more fortunate than ourselves,  
 All **We confess to you, Lord.**

Our intemperate love of worldly goods and comforts, and our dishonesty in daily life and work,  
 All **We confess to you, Lord.**

Our negligence in prayer and worship, and our failure to commend the faith that is in us,  
 All **We confess to you, Lord.**

Accept our repentance, Lord, for the wrongs we have done: for our blindness to human need and suffering, and our indifference to injustice and cruelty,  
 All **Accept our repentance, Lord.**

For all false judgements, for uncharitable thoughts toward our neighbours, and for our prejudice and contempt toward those who differ from us,  
 All **Accept our repentance, Lord.**

For our waste and pollution of your creation, and our lack of concern for those who come after us,  
 All **Accept our repentance, Lord.**

Restore us, good Lord, & let Your anger depart from us;  
 All **Hear us, Lord, for your mercy is great.**

Priest Almighty God, from the dust of the earth You have created us. May these ashes be for us a sign of our mortality and penitence, and a reminder that only by Your gracious gift are we given eternal life; through Jesus Christ our Saviour.  
 All **Amen.**

*Those who desire to receive ashes come forward, and the ashes are applied to the forehead of each person with the following words.*

Remember you are dust, and to dust you shall return.

*After the imposition of ashes, the Priest says*  
 Accomplish in us, O God, the work of your salvation,  
 All **That we may show forth your glory in the world.**

By the cross and passion of your Son, our Lord,  
 All **Bring us with all your saints to the joy of his resurrection.**

Priest Almighty God have mercy on you, forgive you all your sins through our Lord Jesus Christ, strengthen you in all goodness, and by the power of the Holy Spirit keep you in eternal life.  
 All **Amen.**

*The Peace*

*The Presiding Priest addresses the people, then says:*  
 The peace of the Lord be always with you.  
 All **and also with you.**  
*Everyone may exchange a sign of Christ's peace*

## LITURGY OF THE SACRAMENT

*The altar is made ready and the Offering gathered.*  
*Prayer over the Gifts*

Merciful God, turn us from sin to faithfulness. Accept our offering, and prepare us to celebrate the death and resurrection of Christ our Saviour, who is alive and reigns with you now and for ever. **Amen.**

### *The Great Thanksgiving (Eucharistic Prayer 3)*

Priest The Lord be with you  
 All **and also with you.**

Priest Lift up your hearts  
 All **we lift them to the Lord.**

Priest Let us give thanks to the Lord our God  
 All **it is right to give our thanks and praise**

*The Proper preface for Lent*

All **Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest. +Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.**

*In words and actions the Presiding Priest recalls the Last Supper, then*  
 Therefore, according to his command  
 All **we remember his death, we proclaim his resurrection, we await his coming in glory.**

*At the conclusion of the prayer, all respond, "Amen".*

*The Lord's Prayer*

Priest As our Saviour taught us, we are bold to say:  
**Our Father...**

*Breaking of the Bread*

*The Presiding Priest breaks the consecrated bread, and may say,*  
 We break this bread to share in the body of Christ.  
 All **We, being many, are one body, for we all share in the one bread.**

*The Communion*

*The Presiding Priest invites the people to communion and may say,*  
 The gifts of God for the People of God.  
 All **Thanks be to God.**

*The celebrant and people receive communion.*

*Prayer after Communion*

*The Presiding Priest prays the Prayer after Communion*

*Blessing and Dismissal*

*The Priest blesses those gathered and the deacon (if present), says:*

Deacon Go in peace to love and serve the Lord.  
 All **Thanks be to God.**
